Amongst other universities, Maluleke has been a visiting professor at Hamburg University (Germany), University of Vienna (Austria), University of Nairobi (Kenya), Calvin University (USA), and University of Helsinki (Finland).

In addition to his more than 100 scholarly publications, Prof. Maluleke has published dozens of opinion pieces in various media platforms, including the Mail and Guardian, Sunday Independent, Sunday World, and various broadcast platforms.
