As part of the NPC's mandate during the last five years, it has contributed to providing an analysis of long-term spatial trends. Spatial or geographical location remains a feature of structural poverty and inequality in South Africa.

The National Development Plan (NDP) recommends an improved planning framework and system of planning between spheres of government. Towards this end, the District Development Model (DDM), which aims to improve the coherence and impact of government service delivery, presents an encouraging opportunity to address some of the key shortcomings in planning, co-ordination and implementation across the three spheres.

The dialogue will bring together stakeholders to discuss the inherited spatial apartheid and how the DDM approach can assist.
